

Susan Engel and Samuel Levin

*A School of Our Own: The Story of the First Student-Run High School
and a New Vision for American Education*

Engel and Levin will share the fascinating story of the Independent Project, the first student-run high school in America. Levin is the founder of the school and Engel is a noted developmental psychologist and founder and director of the Williams Program in Teaching at Williams College. She is also Samuel's mother. As a high school junior, Samuel had already achieved international fame for creating Project Sprout --- the first farm-to-school lunch program in the United States. Frustrated with his high school education, he lobbied for and developed a new school model based on a few simple ideas about what kids need from their high school experience. Since its inception in 2010, the Independent Project has been hailed as a remarkable success and has been featured in NPR, Newsweek and the Washington Post.


