Block Schedule Information

Cohasset High School utilizes a block schedule format. The majority of academic courses are one semester in length. Courses meet on a rotating basis four out of five days per week, and therefore are equivalent to full year courses at a traditional high school. There are some exceptions as grade nine and ten English as well as AP courses that run a full year. The block schedule allows students to take more courses on average than in a traditional schedule, and provides them with the opportunity to move among levels based on their academic development. As a result of the block schedule, students finish a majority of the core curriculum during freshman and sophomore years. This allows them some opportunity to individualize their schedule and pursue personal interests and academic goals. Due to the nature of the block the maximum amount of AP courses taken by a student in any given year is four. It is also important to note that students may not take every discipline during junior and/or senior year due to interest, availability, and or individual schedule customization.

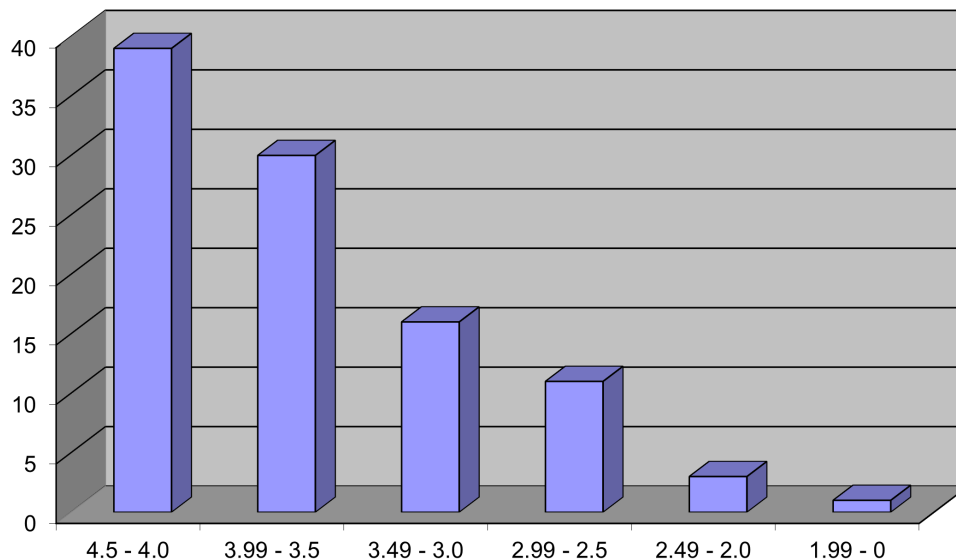
