At the October 28 School Committee Meeting, after discussion regarding updates from the Superintendent Coffees and after listening to parent concerns (mainly regarding the proposed early Deer Hill Elementary start time), the School Committee requested that I re-open efforts to look at school start times for 2020 - 2021. As a result of this request, there were two forums for parental input that took place in early November.

At the November 20 School Committee Meeting, the School Committee voted on and approved a new proposal that has been presented to the Cohasset Teacher Association (CTA) for their potential approval. I will keep all updated when I have more information regarding the final school start times for 2020 - 2021.

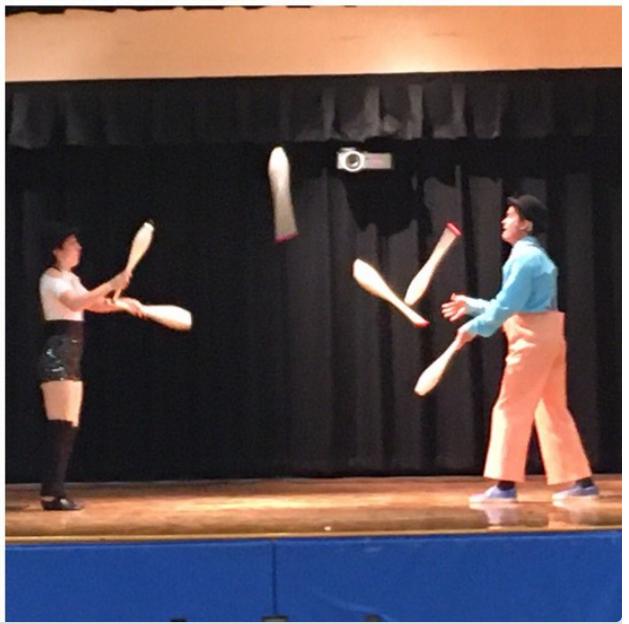
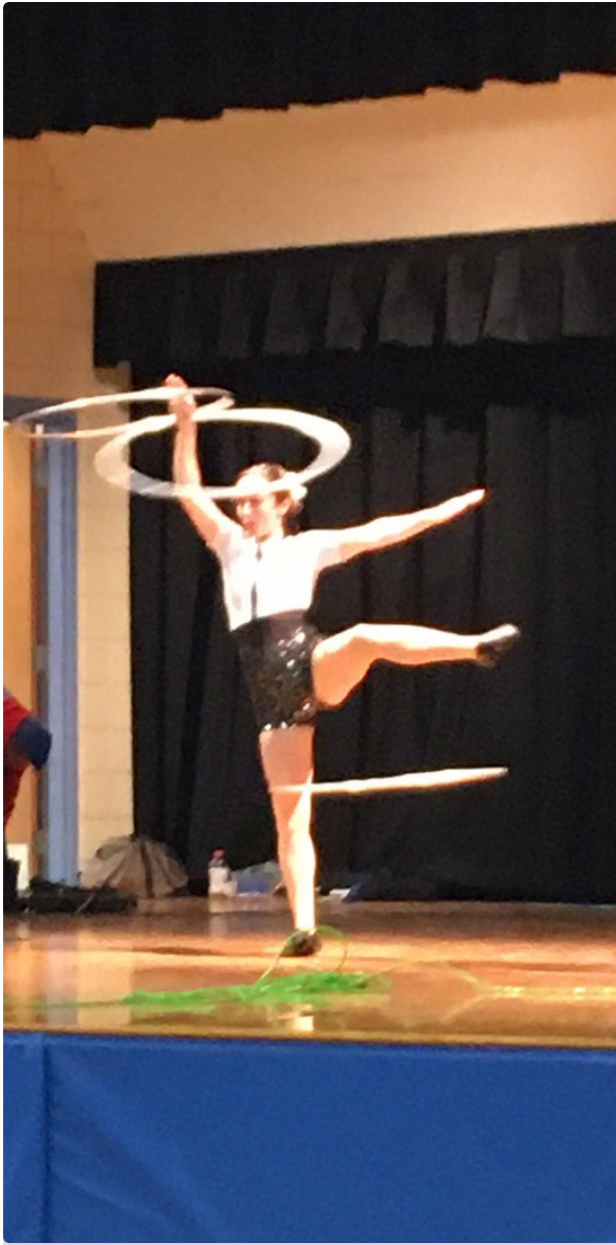


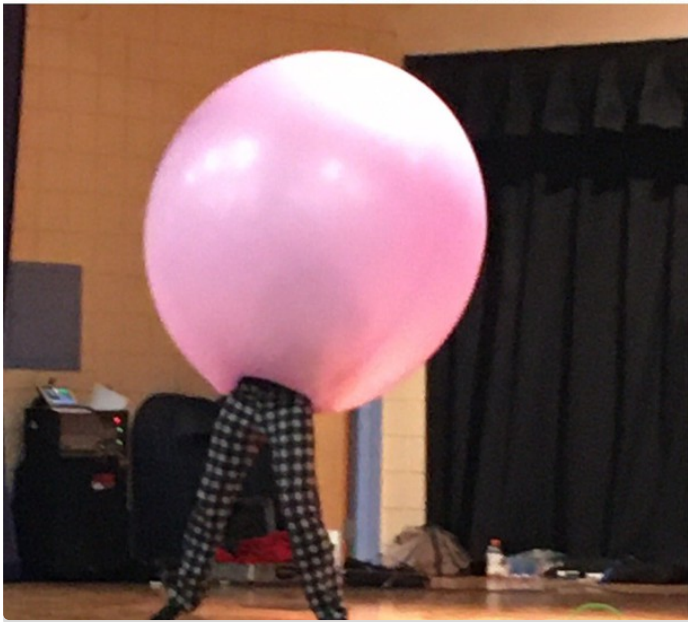


## CIRCUS COMES TO DEER HILL!

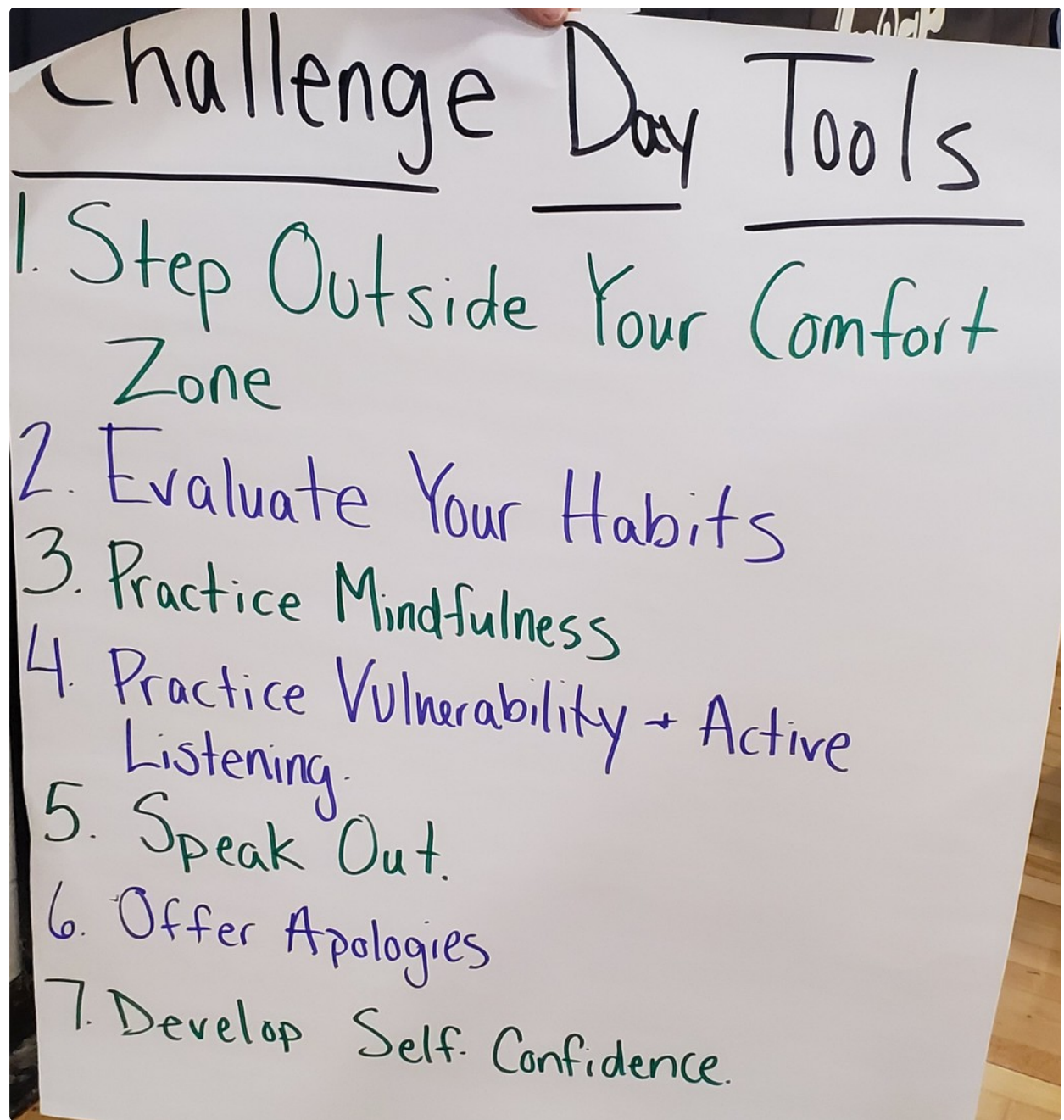
## CHALLENGE DAY: DECEMBER 4

On December 4, seniors (almost all of the class of 2020) participated in a meaningful event called Challenge Day. Challenge Day seeks to build a pathway to empathy by challenging participants to embrace acceptance, allow forgiveness and to empathize with the common and differing experiences of those around them. The expert facilitators brought the students and the over 20 teachers and community members who volunteered through a variety of self-reflection, trust-building, and social awareness activities. This authentic experience allowed students to see the importance of Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) through an emphasis on the Collaborative of Academic and Social-Emotional Learning (CASEL) competencies (self-awareness, self-management, social-awareness, relationship building and responsible decision making). It was one of the more powerful educational and social events I have experienced in my 23 years as an educator. Thank you to Challenge Day, Principal Scott, the CHS team, adult volunteers and students for making this ground-breaking and important day a reality for our students. I am confident that the personal and cultural benefits of this day will resonate throughout the CHS school community.

- ★ Exploring Societal Barriers

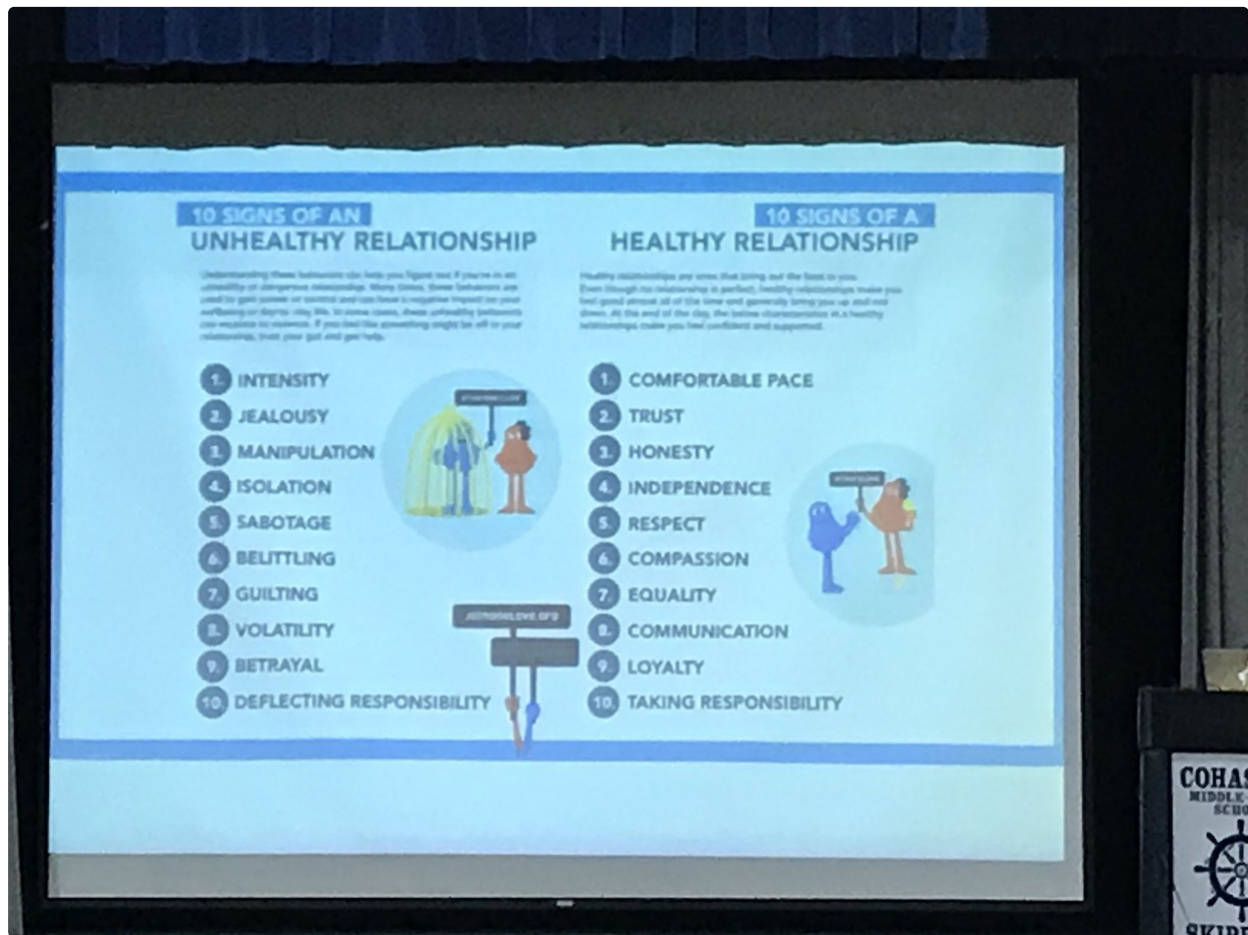

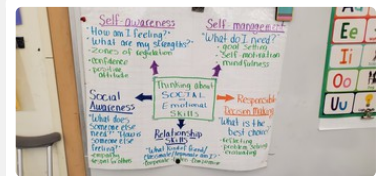
8th grade *Research* students applied their research skills to the following student-chosen topics (and investigating how these topics relate to Cohasset and the South Shore):

- Sustainable Development – Housing Needs vs. Wildlife Habitat

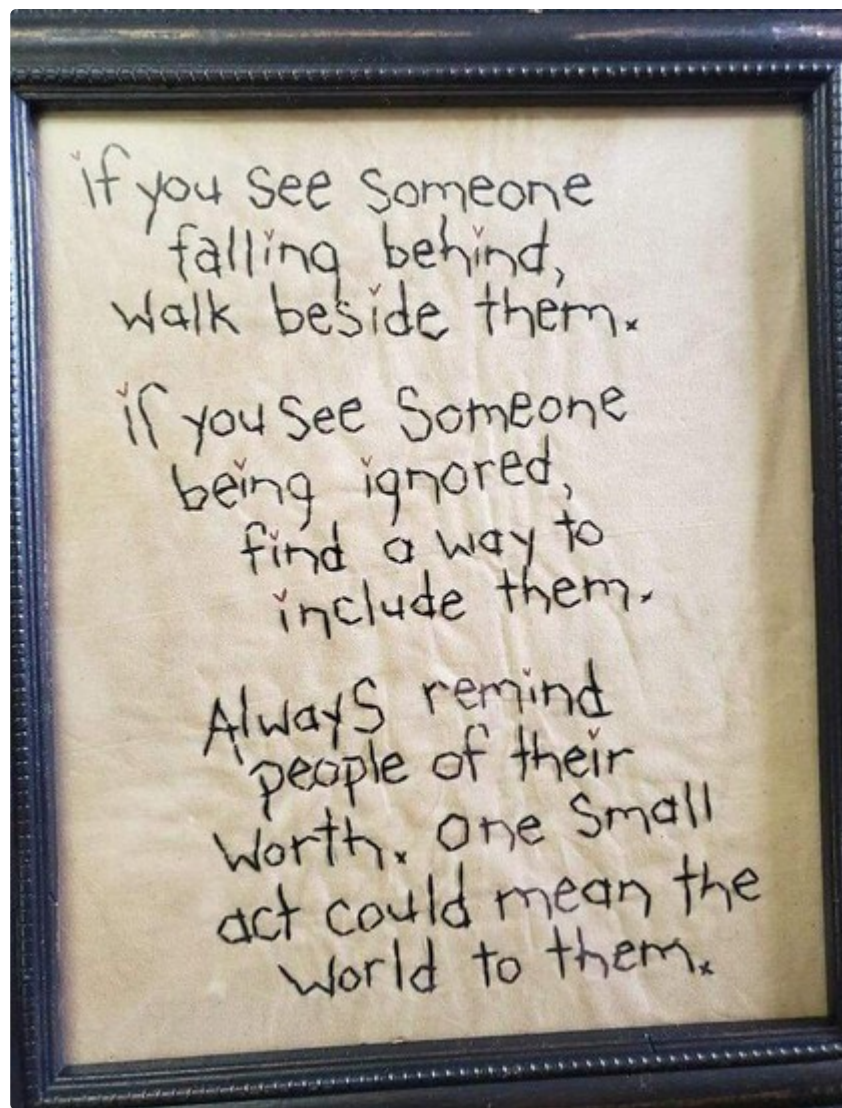

# How to Talk to Your Child at Every Age

## 0- 2 years

- Touch is the first form of communication.
- Use tone and body language to enhance what you say.
- Respond to baby talk with conversation.
- Talking to your child despite his comprehension encourages language skills .

## 3- 5 years

- Give your child your complete attention when possible
- Watch your tone and body language
- Help your child to put words to his emotions.
- Use the help strategy to develop emotional regulation skills
- Offer limited choices and simple explanations

## 6- 11 years

- Make time to talk
- Speak to your child in a respectful manner that presumes a level of maturity
- When trying to get information from your child ask specific questions and keep talking even if they won't talk back.
- Listen without contradicting and repeat what you heard in a more mature manner.
- Allow your child to have some input in family rules.
- Laugh with your child and admit your mistakes.

## 12- 18 years

- Talk with your teen not at him
- Show respect for your teen's opinions.
- Find opportunities such as car rides and television commercials to talk with your teen.
- Respect your teen's privacy and keep their confidences.
- Showing that you trust your teen will in turn encourage them to confide in you.
- Be yourself. A teen is old enough to respect you as an individual.

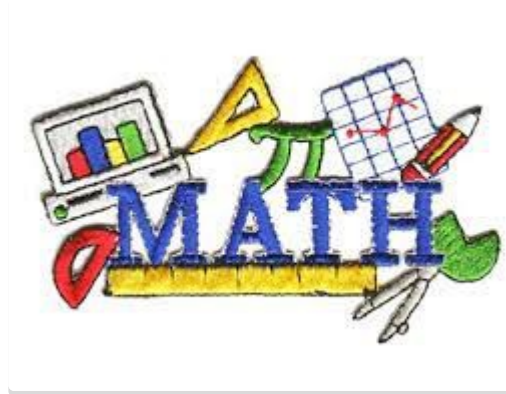
# MCAS

We are currently finalizing the MCAS Calendar and it will be posted this month on the school and district calendars.

Deer Hill, CMS and CHS have all had the opportunity to work with Laura Tilton, a Data Specialist Consultant, to review the MCAS Accountability process as well as dive into the data related to content. Although MCAS is just one indicator of how we are doing as a district it is valuable, it allows us to see trends and patterns that we can use to improve our teaching and learning. The staff were engaged and thoughtful in their words and reflections and walked away with some great information.

There will be a presentation about the 2019 MCAS results at the December 18th School Committee meeting.

## Elementary Math Pilot Update



As I shared earlier, the elementary schools are piloting two math programs (Investigations and Bridges) along with the current enVision math program. The math specialists continue to work closely with the teachers to help them try the new programs while weaving the units into the current curriculum. The pilot process will continue through the spring.

Currently, both programs will be providing professional development for the staff on December 13th. This will allow for teachers to gain more information about the programs as well as to ask questions.

Recently, JOS was the Spotlight on Education as part of the School Committee Meeting. JOS staff members Marcia Campbell, Diane Barbieri, and Jennifer McPhillips presented what they are doing to increase student numeracy and how they are piloting the programs to ensure that all students are being taught grade level content. It was an impressive presentation!

On December 18th there will be a presentation to update the School Committee on the Elementary Math Pilot process. There will also be a presentation at the Deer Hill PSO meeting on January 14th at 9:30am.

The Special Town Meeting in November approved three school capital projects:

- - Upgrading the Middle School Entrance.
- - Purchasing a 7D vehicle for student transportation.
- - Replacing the Middle / High School Auditorium Projector

The work is now underway to select the vendors for these projects and to get the work done. However, we can't rest on our laurels as the process for selecting the capital projects to be voted on in the Spring Town Meeting is now underway. We started work on list this by touring each building to review the condition of the building and it's major components, we have created a comprehensive list of items which are now prioritizing before we submit our requests to the Town Capital Committee.

Highlights of the list are roofs, classroom furniture and technology and repairing the CMHS sidewalks and roads and the Alumni Field and Track. Though not all of these will be tackled in this year.

### **FY 21 BUDGET PROCESS**

Work has begun on the school budget for next year. We will be presenting a "first pass" of the budget to School Committee at the December 18 School Committee Meeting. Over the next few months more information will be provided on the District website.

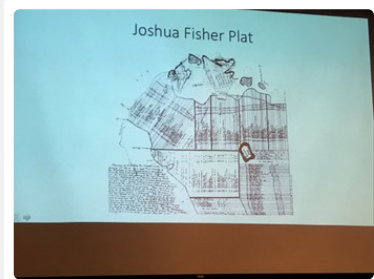
